He is the co-editor of *Call and Response: Key Debates in African American Studies*. He is Editor-in-Chief of the Oxford African American Studies Center, the first comprehensive scholarly online resource in the field of African American and Africana Studies. He is co-editor, with K. Anthony Appiah, of *Africana: The Encyclopedia of the African and African American Experience*.
